Ottawa, April 8, 2010 – The Speaker of the Senate of the Republic of Poland, Bogdan Borusewicz, announced as keynote speaker of the sold out Quo Vadis II conference.

We are pleased to announce that the Speaker of the Senate of the Republic of Poland, Bogdan Borusewicz, will deliver the keynote address at the sold out Quo Vadis II: Building Bridges, Building Leaders conference. The keynote address will take place during the opening ceremonies on Friday May 7th at 3:00pm in the CAW Student Centre at the University of Windsor. A press conference will precede the event.

Bogdan Borusewicz is the first Speaker of the Polish Senate to have served two terms in this office. Prior to this he served as the Deputy Marshal between 2001 and 2005 as well as the Deputy Minister of Internal Affairs and Administration between 1997 and 2000. From 1991 through 2001 he served as a parliamentarian in the Sejm of Poland, first representing the Solidarity Trade Union and then the Democratic Union. Mr. Borusewicz is noted as a principal organizer in the Solidarity movement. He holds a degree in history from Lublin Catholic University.
